Paul McGraw gained a BSc (Hons) in Optometry from Glasgow Caledonian University in 1990. After spending a year at the Glasgow Eye Infirmary and Tenant Institute of Ophthalmology he registered with the General Optical Council. He completed a PhD in Clinical Vision Science, also at Glasgow Caledonian University, in 1995. Following this, Paul took up a post-doctoral position at the University of Bradford. In 1997, he became a *Wellcome Trust Research Fellow in Vision Science* and was subsequently awarded a *Wellcome Trust Research Career Development Fellowship* (2000-2004). In 2004, Paul moved to the University of Nottingham where he became a Reader in Experimental Psychology and was awarded a prestigious *Wellcome Trust University Fellowship* (2005-2010). He was appointed to an endowed Chair in 2006 and from 2010-2018 served as Head of the School of Psychology at the University of Nottingham. Paul currently serves on the Editorial Board of *Vision Research* and *Ophthalmic and Physiological Optics* and is a member of the Grant Advisory Panel at the charity *Fight for Sight*. His research interests are broad, spanning topics such as visual development, sensory learning and rehabilitation, multi-sensory perception, oculomotor control and anomalies of spatial and binocular vision.
